Refugee Participation

Refugee participants must fill in a registration form, checking the REFUGEE category, and send it to the CCR office by **Friday, November 19th.**

These sessions will be an opportunity to share information about the CCR and to meet others who will be attending the Consultation, so that you can get the most out of your participation.

About CCR Consultations

The Canadian Council for Refugees (CCR) consultations address issues of refugee protection and immigrant and refugee settlement. Bringing together 300 or more people from across Canada and beyond twice a year, they offer key opportunities for information exchange, networking, strategy development and discussion. Participants include refugees, immigrants, representatives of NGOs, government, UNHCR, academics, community workers, youth advocates and international guests.

People who work with newcomers and those with a personal interest in refugees and immigrants are warmly invited, especially youth.

The consultation is an excellent opportunity to:

- > meet and learn from experts in the field
- > gain professional training and strategize on a wide range of topics
- > exchange information and prepare resolutions and action plans on a broad range of refugee and newcomer issues
- > contribute to the CCR working groups' ongoing dialogue on policy and legislation

The consultation will include participatory workshops, working group meetings to develop specific resolutions and action plans, and a CCR general meeting. These discussions will result in concrete actions.
