

Family reunification for all: Meeting with a Member of Parliament

A. Request a meeting with your Member of Parliament

- Find the MP's contact details at: http://bit.ly/qyxfKQ
- The best time to meet your MP locally is when Parliament is not in session. Your MP will likely be in their riding these weeks: 13-17 March, 27-31 March, 17-28 April 2017
- Some suggested wording:

I am writing to request a meeting as part of the Canadian Council for Refugees' Family Reunification Campaign.

This campaign is based on the principle that all families have equal value. However, Canada's immigration system treats families unequally – by immigration category, by world region and by law.

We would like an opportunity to talk about how these issues affect members of your constituency and how we can move towards solutions.

B. Gather together a small (3-4 person) team to attend the meeting

- Include someone who is personally affected by the family reunification issue. For tips to help prepare: http://ccrweb.ca/en/meeting-preparation-lived-experience
- If you haven't met the MP, find out a bit about them (a good source is https://openparliament.ca/)
- Identify ways in which the family reunification issues affect people in the MP's riding in particular.
- Make sure you know how long the MP is giving you for the meeting so you can plan properly.
- Agree on the plan for the meeting, using the suggested outline below.
- Plan the team's remarks carefully and be selective. You can't hope to communicate everything. It is better for the MP to go away with a clear message, than to be confused by too much information. Leave plenty of time for the MP to ask questions.

C. The meeting

The following structure is meant to serve as a guideline, not as a rigid and only approach to your meeting with the *MP* (based on 30 minutes).

a) Introduction (3 minutes)

Introduce yourselves and establish your connections with the constituency.

Explain that you are participating in a national campaign led by the Canadian Council for Refugees, an umbrella organization with about 180 member organization.

b) Present the main campaign issue (10 minutes)

Give the MP the campaign handout and explain the main issues covered:

If one of the team is personally affected by one of these issues, have them speak to their situation.

Outline clearly the recommendations.

c) Feedback from MP (10-15 minutes)

Ask the MP for feedback. Ask whether the MP supports the recommendations, and if so, what they can do to support them.

d) Speak to another issue (optional: 5 mins)

f) Conclusion (2 minutes)

Thank the MP for meeting Recap the commitments made and promise to follow up with their office.
