Canada is one of the top three countries of resettlement (with USA and Australia)

Canada's Private Sponsorship of Refugees Program is unique in the world. The people of Canada were awarded the **Nansen Medal** in 1986, for enthusiastically welcoming South-East Asian refugees.

The need for resettlement is greater than ever.

## Refugee resettlement to Canada 1979 - 2015



What are the advantages of these different streams?

Government-assisted refugees 🛛 🖛	Privately sponsored refugees
The government is fulfilling its international responsibility, on behalf of all Canadians, to protect refugees through resettlement.	Canadians can <b>add</b> to the numbers of refugees given a permanent home by privately sponsoring refugees.
Government-assisted refugees are often among the most vulnerable, and need the support of professional settlement services.	Private sponsors can name the refugees they wish to resettle, and so respond to people of concern to them, including those who are forgotten by governments and the UN.
The government can contribute to solutions internationally by resettling many refugees from a specific situation.	Private sponsorship connects individual Canadians and refugees, benefitting both.

What are the main challenges?

• Until 2016, numbers of refugees arriving had been declining Very slow processing
Restrictive rules limiting who can be sponsored

## What we need to do:

Increase number of Government-assisted refugees to at least 20,000 a year Solve the restrictions and delays that have been undermining the private sponsorship program.
