From 24-26 November 2010 refugee and immigrant rights advocates from across Canada will be gathering in Calgary for the Canadian Council for Refugees Fall Consultation. This is a fantastic opportunity for youth advocates for refugee and immigrant rights to work together.

# Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) about the Canadian Council for Refugees Fall Consultation:

#### **Q: How do I register for the Consultation?**

A: Information about the CCR Fall Consultation and how to register can be found at: <u>http://www.ccrweb.ca/meetings</u>. The early registration fee for youth under the age of 25 is \$10, and registration grant are available for the first 30 youth delegates from the Calgary area who register before November 5<sup>th</sup>. Get your forms in early!

## Q: I'm interested in protecting the rights of refugees and I want to get involved. How do I do this?

Everyone has something to contribute to the conference. We are organizing a special informal 'orientation' on Tuesday, November 23rd at the conference site. This way you can meet other youth attending the conference, find out about the workshops in more detail and get some answers to some of the burning questions that you have. Details about where and when this get-together takes place will follow. Let Cynthia know you're interested in attending at cbeaudry@ccrweb.ca

### Q: I don't belong to any group, but I am interested in promoting refugee rights in my community. Can I still attend the Consultation?

A: Absolutely! Registration to the Consultation is open to anyone interested in promoting refugee rights in Canada and internationally. Only the participation of government representatives and members of the media is restricted to certain sessions.

## Q: There are a number of people in my group who are interested in attending. How many representatives from one group can register for the conference?

A: All of you can! There is no limit to the number of delegates that a single group can sponsor.

#### Q: Does the registration fee cover meals, accommodation, and travel to the Consultation?

A: The registration fee (\$10) for youth covers admission to the conference and refreshments there, but not breakfast, lunch or dinner. It doesn't include travel or accommodation either. BUT...

There is limited travel funding for youth (age 18-25) to participate in the Fall Consultation in Calgary. Do you live outside of Calgary? Apply today! The funding will cover travel to Calgary, accommodation (shared hotel room) and registration. Other costs such as food and local transportation are not covered. The CCR particularly encourages the participation of refugee youth in its conferences, but funding will not be limited to youth with a refugee background.

For accommodation: staying at Coast Plaza Hotel, where the Consultation is taking place, is not the cheapest option available, but we can try to make costs lighter for you. Here are some more reasonable accommodation alternatives that are close to the Consultation site:

It's a direct bus ride to the Consultation site – take bus #202 from the City Hall C-Train station. Rooms start at \$27 per night per person. Contact the hostel for more information.

It may be possible to find you a billet in Calgary. A member of the local organizing committee in Calgary will try to meet your request (The earlier you write to Marisa, the greater the possibilities!).
