Victims of human trafficking, most of whom are women and children, are often criminalized, detained, and deported. Given this retraumatization, most are unable to restore their lives. They fall back into the web of the traffickers.

Without a legislative mechanism to protect victims, people who are trafficked can not access basic survival services. Nor can they count on other support such as translation/interpretation, counseling, or legal advice which may make them aware of available alternatives.

Although there is widespread anecdotal evidence of the presence of trafficked persons in Canada, immigrant and refugee serving organizations who wish to be responsive to trafficked persons are telling us that it is very difficult when no alternatives other than deportation are offered to trafficked persons.
